## 2014/2015 Pre-Degree 2<sup>nd</sup> semester exam concluded

The Pre-degree Unit of Federal University Oye-Ekiti has just conducted the second semester examination for its students for the 2014/2015 academic session. The examination which started with mock or demo exercises on Tuesday 30<sup>th</sup> June, 2015 commenced fully on 2<sup>nd</sup> July, 2015 and lasted two days.

The students, numbering one hundred and seventy three (173), were split into two batches according to their faculties. According to the Administrative Secretary of Pre-Degree, Mr. Ayodele Fatuase, faculties of Agriculture, Engineering and Sciences had a total number of ninety nine (99) students who sat for the exam on 2<sup>nd</sup> July while Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences had seventy four (74).

Mr. Fatuase further disclosed that a prerequisite for admission is that a student would have scored 180 and above in JAMB and must have sat for first and second semester exams. Besides, candidates that went through the pre-degree programme must possess necessary entry requirements into the university as required by Joint Admission and Matriculation Board Examination (JAMB).

However, such candidates would have advantage over 'external' candidates that would apply for admission into the university. He restated that admission into Federal University Oye-Ekiti is strictly based on merit.

The examinations which were supervised by Pre-degree staff and some staff of the ICT commenced at 10:00am and ended by 12noon.

## FUOYE PROCURES 175 COMPUTERS, OTHERS.

Federal University Oye-Ekiti has just acquired more computers for use in the institution.

A total of one hundred and seventy five (175) desktop computers, one hundred and seventy five uninterrupted power supply (UPS) units and ten scanners were procured.

Inspecting the computer sets, the visibly impressed Vice Chancellor, Professor Isaac Asuzu, expressed satisfaction at the supply and noted that the university was moving gradually to its full potentials.

Acting Director ICT, Dr. Ken Egbo received the vice chancellor at the newly completed ultra-modern University ICT centre, phase II.

Also present was representative of the Director of Procurement, Ikechukwu Areh, Mr. Efuntade and Seun Ojedeji of the ICT.

The vice chancellor urged all staff to always display sense of ownership with regards to university property. He was obviously unimpressed with the bushy surroundings of the new complex and admonished those present to always see every property of FUOYE as theirs and therefore take every necessary precaution to ensure it is taken good of. He also directed that any breach in the security protocol of the university should be reported to the appropriate quarters for prompt actions.

## FRSC CERTIFIES FUOYE VEHICLE FLEET

The Federal Road Safety Corps (FRSC) has disclosed that besides arresting road traffic offenders and enforcing road traffic laws, the Command has other functions put in place to reduce carnage on the road. Speaking at the certificate presentation ceremony at the Federal University Oye-Ekiti, Road Safety Commander, Ido unit, Mr. A. O. Fasakin, said some measures have been put in place to ensure safe motoring on our highways. One of such measures is the safety standardization scheme which entails the Command's inspection of vehicle fleets of government MPDs and non-governmental institutions such as NURTW garages and the drivers.

In pursuance of this new policy thrust, the Command visited over twenty (20) institutions and government agencies to assess the health of the vehicles in their fleet. Reports generated from the exercise were consequently forwarded to headquarters office of FRSC at Abuja for analysis and scoring. At the end of their last exercise, only three out of the twenty organizations visited were certified by the Corps; Federal Medical Centre Ido, Ido-Osi Local Government and of course, Federal University Oye-Ekiti.

Receiving the certificate of Certification in his office, the Vice Chancellor, Federal University Oye-Ekiti, Professor Isaac. U. Asuzu, appreciated the hard work of FRSC both in traffic control and even at road crash scenes. He was full of praise for the efforts of the Command which have cumulated in reduced accidents on the roads especially during festivities. According to him, "if you don't control traffic, the carnage on our roads would be very grievous." He therefore thanked the Command for their efforts at bringing sanity on the highways.

The vice chancellor also acceded to the request of the Command to conduct free training for the university drivers and even other staff and advised them to come up with a formal request letter. Earlier, the FRSC had disclosed that enforcement of the proposed Speed Limit Device on all commercial vehicles would take off September 1, 2015 starting with organizations and NURTW.

The Registrar, D. A. Adeyemo, hailed the proposed take-off of the Speed Limit Device on vehicles and the proposed training of drivers and other staff of the university. Other principal officers present were the Bursar, Barrister Bashir O. Badmus and University Librarian, Dr. Gboyega Adio. Also present were the following Deans: Professor Olusegun Oladimeji, Agriculture; Professor Ojo Bakare, Humanities & Social Sciences; Professor Sylvia Uzochukwu represented by Dr. (Mrs) M.A. Oyarekhua, Sciences and Ag. Director PPU, Engr. F. Adebayo.

Here are nuggets of information from the SERVICOM Unit of the Federal University Oye Ekiti.

The highpoint of the event was a game of table tennis between the vice chancellor and the registrar, and of course the chief executive carried the day in a gallant style.

Other winners were Mr. Gabriel Okoli of Computer Science Department who won the chess game, Mr. Sam Adeleye of Maintenance Unit who won the male category of ayo-olopon and Mrs. Ademolaju who won the female category of ayo-olopon. In scrabble, Mr. Gbenga Ogundare of Academic Planning Unit won the contest while Mr. Akomolafe Omotayo of Medical Centre and Mr. Femi Abioluwa from Security Unit had the day in the draughts game.
